

SSAC Shore Rules

- 2 rods 3 hooks (one rig can be a Pennel with the hooks not to exceed more than

3" apart from eye of the fix to the gape of the floating hook (this will count as one

hook)

- Comp fee is £3.50 to which £0.50p (subject to change) will go to the club for

stationery etc, £2.00 of the entry will go to the best 2 fish on % combine or best

single fish if 2 species are not caught, £1.00 of the entry fee will go to the winner on

points, £1.50 (optional) pool to be paid out for the best fish of the night on %

- 1st place 5 point for best 2 fish, 2nd place 4 points second best 2 fish, 3rd place 3

points for third best 2 fish on %

- Any angler winning the fish prize money will not eligible for the points money and the points money will go to the next best points

- 1--9 anglers –pay anglers first place only, 10--14 anglers pays first and second (1st 70%

2nd 30%) 15 anglers or more pays first second and third (1st 50% 2nd 30% and 3rd

20%) this will round off at the nearest pound at the discretion of the comp organiser

- In the event that there are no fish caught the entry fee money plus pool money

will at a later date passed on to the RNLI as a donation to there charity

- All fish to be measured in metric and fish to be weighed in imperial

- Anglers can sign on before the signing time but can not leave the signing on area

before 1 hour of the comp starting

- Anglers must tell the comp organiser where they are fishing, for safety reasons,

the angler must tick the box on his/hers match recorded sheet

- You must enter your points on the record sheet not the size
- There will be a Golden fish on the form every comp and it will be a different species

for double points.

- Any angler leaving before the end of the comp MUST tell the organiser or phone the

club number on the form that they are leaving there is no grace on this rule it is set

in stone. If you do not contact anyone to let them know you will be called at home

and on your mobile to find out the whereabouts you are. This call could be at

midnight.

- Club organiser and personal with club scale will be wearing a hi viz vest to stand out

from the crowd to help you spot them

- If any angler wants to return a fish i.e. Ray or bass providing it's been weighed on

certificated scale witnessed or photographed, the club will except the catch.

- No mini species can be weighed at the end but will be given 1pt on the score sheet it

will not be weighed for the comps but if you think it could be a club

record/WYVERN/SWFSA/ANGLING TRUST/NFSA/British record then do bring it back.

- Harbour fishing will be excepted in a club comp at certain times of the year and on

discretion comp organiser

- Any disputes must be logged before the scales are closed. Scales close Half hour

after the comp end time . If the dispute isn't resolved then it will be done at the next

club meeting and there discussion will be final

- Any angler leaving early but wants their fish to count must take

them to the nearest

competitor. Refer to an scale holder with the fish can be weighed/recorded /and

returned and can be taken to the weigh in to be recorded.

All fish must be kept in a clean bucket of sea Water for the weigh in so they can be

returned carefully

- Plugging and feathering are not permitted but spinning is permitted as long as the

spinner has a single hook (not a treble) on it

- Wetting of lines is permitted as long as there is no bait attached

- All lines must be out of the water by the finishing time stated

- If a fish is hooked before the end of the comp time the angler is permitted time to

land the fish but must be back before the closing of the scales to register the fish

- Assistant to help land a fish is permitted

- Boundary for fishing the Seaton comps are from Seaton hole to coverall point

- All anglers must have a fish measure and a bucket to enter the comps

- Juniors to be encouraged to take part . Those under 14 must be accompanied by a

parent or guardian at all times

- Under 16's who win prizes will receive a credit to an equivalent value at Seaton

angling centre

- Please note – you are fishing at your own risk. The club will not except

responsibility for your own loss, damages or Injuries

- The club has third party insurance for comps and club events only

- **Attention if any undersized fish are brought back to the weighing there will be a fine**

of £5.00 to which that money will be put in to a charity box of the RNLI
